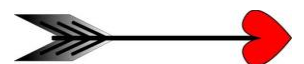
"MY STORY".....By Trigger

Found A Lost Pet?

Logan's Run Has Proven Successful Steps to Help You Save Them!!!

Have you ever come across an abandoned pet and wondered what do I do?

Logan's Run Rescue has rescued more than 500 lost pets in our communities in less than two years.

The lives saved are due to the compassion and participation of those 300+ people who found the abandoned pets and decided to get involved.

Successful Steps to save the next life that crosses your path!

First Step: Check for Pet Identification

- Check for Tags. Even a rabies tag can be traced. Just contact the rabies tag phone #.
- Take the animal to a vet hospital to have it scanned for a microchip (tags can get lost, but microchips are fool-proof in finding the owner). micro-chips.

Second Step: Create a Found a Lost Pet Flyer

- **Found a Lost Pet Flyer** Information: Where Pet was found, Pet Description, Picture of Pet's Face, your contact information.
- Distribute them throughout the community and the vet offices (sometimes you can email them). Many times the owner is also searching for their pet. We have reunited desperately-seeking pet owners with their pets through this effort. Remember, post widely, as animals can travel great distances from homes. And, don't forget to post at the vet offices. Owners looking for their pets contact their Vets!



Third Step: Find a Temporary Foster Home and call Logan's Run Rescue

- Logan's Run Rescue does not have housing facilities or foster homes. Call us once you have a foster home willing to give the pet a home for 6 to 12 weeks. LRR will spay/neuter the animal, and help seek an adoption or transport to an adoption facility. Can't foster at your home? Call your contacts to help you secure a temporary home until the pet is adopted. Rescuing abandoned animals takes time ~ weeks not days!

Fourth Step: Create a Pet for Adoption Flyer if Pet Owner cannot be located

- Take 3 pictures. 1st picture: the pet's face; 2nd picture: one of the whole body with head shot; 3rd picture: show affection and the pet relaxed with a person/child.
- Tell the Pet's Story, how it was lost and then found, etc. Include the pet's good traits and the bad, too! No Surprises- - smooth the path to Great Adoptions without Returns!
- Email the flyer to everyone in your email contact list. Let them know this pet is important to you and you need their help. Ask them to help find a home by forwarding to their contact list.
- Keep flyers with you to hand out. Don't forget to notify your social and business contacts.

Two older dogs were kennel mates at a no-kill shelter with one dog's kennel adjacent to the room's only window. The other dog, old with arthritis, spent most of his time lying down in his adjoining kennel. The dogs talked for hours on end. Every afternoon the dog by the window would pass the time by describing to his friend all the things he could see outside the window.
